Resolve, Requiring the Judicial Branch to Report on the Implementation and Operation of Its Electronic Filing System

- 1 **Sec. 1. Judicial branch to report on electronic filing system. Resolved:** That 2 the judicial branch shall prepare and submit a report to the Joint Standing Committee on 3 Judiciary regarding the implementation and operation of the judicial branch's electronic 4 filing system. The report must include at least the following:
- 5 1. A detailed accounting of all costs associated with the implementation and operation 6 of the electronic filing system, including initial investments, ongoing maintenance and any 7 unanticipated expenditures;
- 8 2. An overview of the training provided to judicial branch personnel, including judges, 9 clerks and other staff, designed to instruct personnel to effectively use the electronic filing 10 system. The report must address the sufficiency of the training and identify any gaps or 11 challenges;
- 3. An updated timeline for the full implementation of the electronic filing system,including an anticipated completion date for statewide adoption;
- 4. An assessment of the satisfaction levels of judges, clerks and other court personnel
 regarding the usability and functionality of the electronic filing system. The assessment
 must identify any issues or areas for improvement;
- 5. An evaluation of alternative electronic filing software options that could be
 considered for use by the judicial branch, including a comparison of functionality, costs
 and ease of use; and
- 6. Any recommendations for legislative or administrative action to address challenges
 or improve the efficiency and effectiveness of the electronic filing system.
- Sec. 2. Resources; submission; authority to report out legislation. Resolved: That the report must be completed with existing resources and submitted to the Joint Standing Committee on Judiciary for review no later than December 3, 2025. The committee may report out legislation based on the findings and recommendations contained in the report to the Second Regular Session of the 132nd Legislature.

SUMMARY

28 This resolve directs the judicial branch to submit a comprehensive report to the Joint 29 Standing Committee on Judiciary regarding the implementation of the electronic filing 30 system. The report must address costs, training, implementation progress, satisfaction 31 among judges, clerks and other staff and alternative electronic filing software options and 32 must include any recommendations for legislative or administrative action necessary to 33 improve the electronic filing system. The judicial branch must complete the report with 34 existing resources and must submit the report to the committee no later than December 3, 35 2025. The committee is authorized to report out legislation based on the report to the Second Regular Session of the 132nd Legislature. 36
