Rate determination for doula services. Resolved: That, no later than 15 January 1, 2026, the Department of Health and Human Services shall initiate a rate 16 determination process according to the requirements of the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 17 22, section 3173-J for the provision of doula services under the MaineCare program with a planned start for reimbursement, subject to sufficient appropriations from the Legislature, 18 19 of January 1, 2028. For the purposes of this resolve, "doula services" means the provision 20 of services to a person by a nonclinical professional related to the physical, emotional and 21 informational support of that person throughout pregnancy, labor, birth and the postpartum 22 period, including, but not limited to, guidance and support concerning pregnancy health, 23 childbirth, infant feeding and newborn care. 24 Sec. 2. Doula council. Resolved: That the department shall establish a 25 multidisciplinary statewide doula council to provide advice and make recommendations to 26 the department regarding doula services, including consulting in the rate determination 27 process pursuant to section 1. The doula council must include practicing doulas. The doula 28 council must provide advice to the department on topics, including, but not limited to, the 29 scope of doula services that could become eligible for reimbursement under the MaineCare 30 program, appropriate credentials for doulas, strategies for recruiting a diverse workforce of 31 doulas to provide services in the State, reimbursement and billing issues and outreach to 32 the public about how to access doula services. 33 Sec. 3. Report. MaineCare program pursuant to section 2. The report must include recommendations on the appropriateness of MaineCare reimbursement for doula services, a timeline for implementation of rates and state plan amendments, the necessary budget requests to fund the provision of doula services under the MaineCare program and a permanent structure for a doula council. The joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over health and human services matters is authorized to report out legislation to the 133rd Legislature in 2027.'

Amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively.

SUMMARY

11 This amendment replaces the bill with a resolve requiring the Department of Health 12 and Human Services to initiate a rate determination process for developing rates for doula 13 services under the MaineCare program. The department shall establish a doula council to 14 provide advice on issues related to reimbursement, credentialing, recruitment, billing and 15 outreach. The department shall submit a report, no later than February 1, 2027, to the joint 16 standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over health and human services 17 matters that includes the department's progress on developing rates and recommendations 18 for reimbursement of doula services under the MaineCare program. The committee is 19 authorized to report out legislation related to the report to the 133rd Legislature in 2027. 20
