Sec. 1. 36 MRSA §1483, sub-§12, as amended by PL 2021, c. 240, §1, is further
amended to read:

4 Certain veterans. Automobiles owned by veterans who are granted free 12. 5 registration of those vehicles by the Secretary of State under Title 29-A, section 523, 6 subsection 1 or who are disabled by injury or disease incurred or aggravated during active military service in the line of duty and are receiving any form of pension or compensation 7 8 from the United States Government for total, service-connected disability. In order for an 9 automobile to qualify for an exemption from the excise tax under this subsection, the name of the qualifying veteran must appear on the automobile's certificate of title. If there are 10 multiple owners of an automobile, at least one of the owners whose name appears on the 11 certificate of title must meet the requirements of this subsection in order for the automobile 12 13 to qualify for the exemption;
