| 13 | MAINE'S CARE FORCE |
| 14 | §791. Short title |
| 15 | This chapter may be known and cited as "the Maine's Care Force Act." |
| 16 | §792. Definitions |
| 17 18 | 1. Essential support worker. "Essential support worker" has the same meaning as in section 7401, subsection 3. |
| 19 | 2. Participant. "Participant" means an individual enrolled in Maine's Care Force. |
| 20 21 | 3. Placement site. "Placement site" means a location where an essential support worker is deployed, including a home, health care facility, community center or fire department. |
| 22 | §793. Maine's Care Force |
| 23 | 1. Establishment. Maine's Care Force is established within the department. |
| 24 25 26 27 | 2. Maine's Care Force Fund. The Maine's Care Force Fund is established as a nonlapsing fund within and administered by the department to support Maine's Care Force. The commissioner may accept funds from any public or private source for the purposes described in this chapter. |
| 28 | 3. Authority. In administering Maine's Care Force, the department shall: |
| 29 | A. Develop and deliver essential support worker training and certification programs; |
| 30 | B. Provide health care, housing and subsistence for participants; |
| 31 32 | C. Deploy essential support workers to underserved areas based on community need: and |
| 33 | D. Monitor essential support workers and provide ongoing support. |
| 34 | 4. Eligibility. To enroll as participants in Maine's Care Force, individuals must: |

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| 3 4 | 5. Training. The department shall develop and administer a training curriculum for participants, which must include: |
| 5 | A. Care of older adults, children and individuals with disabilities; |
| 6 7 | B. Physical activity and gameplay for the purpose of enhancing resilience and teamwork; |
| 8 | C. Life skills, financial literacy and English language training; and |
| 9 10 | D. Certifications in first aid, cardiopulmonary resuscitation and medication management. |
| 11 | 6. Participant benefits. The department shall provide participants with the following: |
| 12 13 | A. Comprehensive health care coverage, including medical, dental and vision coverage; |
| 14 15 | B. Subsidized housing near placement sites, supported by monthly stipends during training and placement; and |
| 16 | C. Skills certifications. |
| 17 18 19 20 21 | 7. Placement and support of participants. The department shall coordinate placement of participants for employment in private homes, facilities and community-based settings and shall provide ongoing mentorship and mental health resources. The department shall coordinate with placement sites to provide compensation to participants for services. |
| 22 23 24 | 8. Funding. The department may accept and administer loans, grants or other funds or gifts, conditional or otherwise, in furtherance of its functions, from the Federal Government and from other sources, public or private. |
| 25 26 | 9. Evaluation. The department shall provide for independent evaluations of Maine's Care Force every 5 years in order to assess effectiveness and recommend improvements. |
| 27 28 29 | 10. Reports. Beginning January 1, 2026 and annually thereafter, the department shall submit a report to the Governor and to the joint committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over health and human services matters that includes: |
| 30 | A. The number of participants trained and placed during the prior year; |

| 32 | C. The results of participant satisfaction surveys; and |
