Once a public hearing has begun, the amount of time set for the first member of the public providing testimony must be allowed for each following member of the public providing testimony until the conclusion of the hearing.'
20 21	Amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively.

23 24 25 26	This amendment, which is the minority report of the committee, clarifies that once a public hearing has begun, the amount of time set for the first member of the public providing testimony must be allowed for each following member of the public providing testimony until the conclusion of the hearing.
