12 13 14 15	Amend the bill in section 2 in subsection 35-A in the last line (page 1, line 12 in L.D.) by inserting after the following: "elected." the following: <u>For the purposes of this subsection</u> , "continuing candidate" has the same meaning as in section 723-A, subsection 1, paragraph C and "highest continuing ranking" has the same meaning as in section 723-A, subsection 1, paragraph E.'
17 18	Amend the bill in section 10 in paragraph I in the 2nd line (page 2, line 31 in L.D.) by inserting after the following: "candidates" the following: 'for that office'
19 <sup>°</sup> 20	Amend the bill in section 10 in paragraph I in the 3rd line (page 2, line 32 in L.D.) by inserting after the following: "ranking" the following: 'of a candidate for an office'

Amend the bill in section 10 in paragraph I in the 4th line (page 2, line 33 in L.D.) by inserting after the following: "count" the following: 'in the election for that office'

Amend the bill in section 11 in paragraph J in the first line (page 2, line 37 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "ballot counting" and inserting the following: 'counting ballot tabulation'

Amend the bill by striking out all of section 12 and inserting the following:

- 'Sec. 12. 21-A MRSA §723-A, sub-§2, as amended by PL 2023, c. 628, §2, is further amended to read:
- 2. Procedures. Except as provided in subsections 3, 4 and 7, the following procedures are used to determine the winner of an election determined by ranked-choice voting. The ranked-choice voting count ballot tabulation must proceed in rounds. In each round, the number of votes for each continuing candidate must be counted. Each continuing ballot eounts as one vote is tabulated for its highest-ranked continuing candidate for that round. Exhausted ballots are not eounted tabulated for any continuing candidate. The round then ends with one of the following 2 potential outcomes.

## COMMITTEE AMENDMENT " A" to S.P. 660, L.D. 1666(5-334)

- A. If there are 2 or fewer continuing candidates, the ranked-choice voting ballot tabulation is complete and each ballot is tabulated as one vote for its highest-ranked continuing candidate, and the candidate with the most receiving a plurality of the votes cast is declared the winner of the election elected.
- B. If there are more than 2 continuing candidates, the last-place candidate is removed from consideration eliminated and a new round begins.'

Amend the bill in section 13 in subsection 5 in the last line (page 3, line 20 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "counting" and inserting the following: 'tabulation'

Amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively.

### SUMMARY

This amendment makes technical adjustments to the bill. It includes statutory references to defined terms used in the definition of "ranked-choice voting." It replaces the term "count" with the term "tabulate" when referring to the process of determining the number of votes cast for a candidate in each round of an election determined by ranked-choice voting. It also clarifies that in the definition of "ranking" the preference being demonstrated by the voter for a candidate is relative to other candidates for the same office on that ballot.
