Resolve, to Establish a Pilot Project to Facilitate the Inclusion of Economic Impact Statements in the Legislative Process

Emergency preamble. Whereas, acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

 Whereas, this resolve establishes a pilot project to facilitate the inclusion of economic impact statements in the legislative process; and

Whereas, the pilot project must be initiated before the 90-day period expires in order that the pilot project may begin in time for the next legislative session; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

- Sec. 1. Economic impact statement pilot project established. Resolved: That the Legislative Council and the University of Maine System shall establish and implement a pilot project to facilitate the inclusion of economic impact statements in the legislative process as described in this resolve.
- Sec. 2. Legislative Council to issue request for proposals for economic impact statement model. Resolved: That, by July 15, 2025, the Legislative Council shall issue a request for proposals to procure an economic impact statement model to be used in a pilot project to analyze legislation during the Second Regular Session of the 132nd Legislature. The economic impact statement model selected by the Legislative Council must consider, but is not limited to, the direct and indirect or secondary economic and demographic effects related to the legislation, including its effect on jobs, investment, income, gross domestic product, taxes and attraction of workers. The Legislative Council shall consult with the University of Maine System when developing the request for proposals. The economic impact statement model must be completed by December 3, 2025.
- Sec. 3. University of Maine System to oversee a pilot project to facilitate inclusion of economic impact statements in legislative process. Resolved: That, upon completion of the economic impact statement model under section 2, but no later than the commencement of the Second Regular Session of the 132nd Legislature, the University of Maine System shall establish and implement a pilot project to facilitate the inclusion of economic impact statements in the legislative process in order to provide information about the economic impacts of legislation and to ascertain how legislation relates to the State's prosperity, productivity and competitiveness.

The University of Maine System, in coordination with the Legislative Council, shall select at least 3 pieces of legislation in each of the following subject areas to be analyzed using the economic impact statement model: taxation, housing, health care, energy and education. The University of Maine System and the Legislative Council shall prioritize legislation that enacts or amends employment, labor or taxation laws; creates a new workforce program; or significantly affects employers, employees or the state economy. The analysis of the economic impact using an economic impact statement model must be in addition to any fiscal impact statement that is prepared.

Sec. 4. Report by University of Maine System. Resolved: That, no later than 45 days following adjournment of the Second Regular Session of the 132nd Legislature, the University of Maine System shall submit a written report on the pilot project established

1 2	pursuant to section 3 detailing the effectiveness of the inclusion of economic impact statements in the legislative process to the Legislative Council.
3 4 5 6 7	Sec. 5. Recommendation for future legislation. Resolved: That, following receipt and review of the report required in section 4, the Legislative Council shall determine whether to expand the use of economic impact statements in the legislative process and make that recommendation, including suggested legislation, for presentation to the Legislative Council of the 133rd Legislature no later than November 4, 2026.
8 9	Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this legislation takes effect when approved.
