§4304. Duties

The board shall advise the Department of Transportation on matters relating to the Maine State Ferry Service and shall submit to the Commissioner of Transportation and to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over transportation matters by December 15th an annual report, which shall must include recommendations for change to the Maine State Ferry Service and comments upon the present and future needs of that service. The Department of Transportation shall also prepare and submit an annual report by December 15th to the board, to the island municipalities and plantations served by the Maine State Ferry Service and to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over transportation matters. The report must include the operating and capital costs, past and projected costs, significant successes and challenges and policy issues of the Maine State Ferry Service. Written reports and comments shall must be available to the public.

The board, in consultation with the Commissioner of Transportation, shall name ferry terminals and ferries constructed for and maintained by the Department of Transportation to operate as part of the Maine State Ferry Service.'

SUMMARY

This amendment, which is a minority report of the committee, replaces the bill and changes the title. The amendment does the following.

- 1. It increases, from 3 to 4, the number of members of the Maine State Ferry Advisory Board appointed by the Commissioner of Transportation and requires one of those members of the board to be a municipal officer from Rockland, Lincolnville or Tremont,
- 2. It requires a member of the board representing an island municipality or plantation, who is appointed by the municipal officers of the member's municipality or by the assessors of the member's plantation, to be the chief administrative official of the island or a current member of the governing body of the island.
- 3. It requires the board to submit an annual report to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over transportation matters, in addition to the Commissioner of Transportation.
- 4. It requires the Department of Transportation to prepare and submit a report to the board, the island municipalities and plantations served by the Maine State Ferry Service and the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over transportation matters. The report must include the operating and capital costs, past and projected costs, significant successes and challenges and policy issues of the Maine State Ferry Service.
- 5. It requires meetings of the board to be public meetings as provided by the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 1, section 403.
