SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1164,
L.D. 1746, "An Act to Reduce Dental Disease and Ensure Access to Essential Preventive
Dental Care Among Maine Children"

Amend the amendment by inserting after the first instructional paragraph the
following:

'Amend the bill in section 2 in the last 3 lines (page 1, lines 17 to 19 in L.D.) by striking
out the following: "The department shall provide for, at least every school year in a
different public health district, at least one mobile dental services provider until each
district has at least one mobile dental services provider."'

Amend the amendment by striking out all of section 4 and inserting the following:

'Sec. 4. Appropriations and allocations. The following appropriations and
allocations are made.

Maine Center for Disease Control and Prevention 0143

Initiative: Provides funding to contract with mobile dental services providers to deliver
services in public schools and provides funding for ongoing training and education for
primary care providers on minimally invasive dental disease treatment.



Fiscal Detail and Notes

This amendment removes funding for fiscal year 2025-26, and removes the two positions that are no longer required for the bill as these positions were continued and made permanent last budget in LD 210 and the Department of Health and Human Services has confirmed they will absorb the work within this bill. The needed funding for the contracts has also been reduced to \$325,000 in fiscal year 2026-27 as this amendment removes the requirement that the Department of Health and Human Services continue to add at least one mobile dental services provider in each district every school year.
