For purposes of this section, "dog licensing agent" means an animal shelter or a veterinarian pursuant to section 3923-F.

SUMMARY

This amendment, which is the majority report of the committee, clarifies that kennel licensees are not required to pay individual dog licensing fees.

The amendment clarifies that a humane agent with the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry may conduct an inspection of a kennel in a municipality with an appointed animal control officer under specific and extenuating circumstances as determined by the department by rule. The amendment requires a municipality to pay for the cost of an inspection if a humane agent conducts the inspection.

The amendment requires a kennel licensee to pay for a background check, which is required to obtain a license. The amendment corrects a cross-reference in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 7, chapter 725 relating to municipal duties and officials' refusal or neglect of duty.

The amendment requires the department to provide annual reports, no later than January 15th in 2026, 2027 and 2028, to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over animal welfare matters on the transfer of the issuance of kennel licenses from municipalities to the department. The joint standing committee may submit legislation relating to the subject matter of the report to the Second Regular Session of the 132nd Legislature, to the 133rd Legislature in 2027 and to the Second Regular Session of the 133rd Legislature.

Fiscal Detail and Notes

This bill authorizes the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry (ACF) to issue kennel licenses in place of municipalities. It establishes a tiered fee structure based on the number of dogs per kennel and directs the ACF to distribute 20% of the revenue collected to municipalities, with the remaining 80% deposited into the Animal Welfare Fund. Because total revenue will depend on the number and size of licensed kennels, an exact estimate is not available at this time.

The bill also increases fees on existing facility licenses. These fee increases are expected to generate \$21,577 in additional Other Special Revenue Funds revenue for the ACF beginning in fiscal year 2025-26. The bill includes a corresponding allocation to authorize expenditure of the additional revenue.
