COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 714, L.D. 1832, "An Act to Clarify Available Relief for the Protection of At-risk Children"

Amend the bill in section 1 in subsection 16 in the 3rd line (page 1, line 6 in L.D.) by inserting after the following: "to" the following: 'Title 19-A, section 1511 and'

Amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively.

**SUMMARY**

This amendment, which is the majority report of the committee, clarifies that the District Court has jurisdiction to adjudicate a motion for special findings for certain at-risk noncitizen children in a court action involving parental rights and responsibilities.

### Correctional and Judicial Impact Statements

This bill may increase the number of civil suits filed in the court system. The additional workload associated with a minimal number of new cases filed in the court system does not require additional funding at this time.
