Fiscal Detail and Notes

This amendment removes the provision of the bill that had necessitated the new positions. The Other Special Revenue Funds allocations associated with those positions have been removed.

The amendment retains provisions that expand the authorized venues where caregivers may sell or transfer medical cannabis and that require annual reporting to include data on gross sales and sales tax revenue from medical cannabis.
