18	This amendment replaces the bill, changes the title and removes the emergency
19	preamble and clause. It requires the Public Utilities Commission, by November 1, 2025,
20	to initiate a competitive solicitation for contracts for energy or renewable energy credits or
21	both from distributed generation resources with a nameplate capacity of less than 5
22	megawatts that have reached mechanical completion before January 1, 2025. The
