B, §23, is further 13 amended to read: 14 §89. Maine Pilotage Commission members The Maine Pilotage Commission, as established by Title 5, section 12004-A, 15 16 subsection 40, consists of 7 members who are citizens of the United States and the State of 17 Maine appointed by the Governor as follows: Three licensed pilots who are actively 18 piloting, one member from each of the coastal zones; 2 members who are not licensed pilots 19 but are from a maritime industry that utilizes the services of pilots; one member who is not 20 a licensed pilot but has a maritime background, from a list of qualified potential appointees 21 provided by the mayor of the City of Portland and the mayor of the City of South Portland; 22 and 2 members one member representing the public who are is not a licensed pilots pilot 23 but have has a maritime background. Appointments are for 3-year terms. Appointments 24 of members must comply with Title 10, section 8009. The members of the commission are 25 entitled to compensation according to Title 5, chapter 379. 26 Sec. 7. 38 MRSA §90, sub-§1, ¶B, as amended by PL 1999, c. 355, §10, is further 27 amended to read: 28 B. Make and establish just and reasonable rates of pilotage for those vessels that are 29 subject to this subchapter; 30 Amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section 31 number to read consecutively. 32 SUMMARY 33 This amendment updates the membership of the Maine Pilotage Commission. It 34 requires one member, rather than 2 members, of the public who is not a licensed pilot but

has a maritime background. It also requires one member who is not a licensed pilot but has
a maritime background, from a list of qualified potential appointees provided by the mayor
of the City of Portland and the mayor of the City of South Portland. The amendment
specifies the Maine Pilotage Commission is required to make just and reasonable pilotage
rates.

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
