12 13	'Emergency preamble. Whereas, acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
14	Whereas, the State continues to face unprecedented homelessness; and
15 16 17	Whereas, Public Law 2023, chapter 412, Part AAAA established the Housing First Program to facilitate the delivery of support and stabilization services to persons experiencing chronic homelessness in the State; and
18 19 20 21	Whereas, among the services allowed through the Housing First Program were housing stability services that provide outreach to persons experiencing chronic homelessness for purposes of establishing connections and providing support that may result in securing stable housing; and
22 23 24 25	Whereas, the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 22, section 20-A, subsection 4, paragraph A requires the Department of Health and Human Services to annually deposit \$1,000,000 in the fund to support the Housing First Program to provide housing stability services, and the department has not yet contracted for those services to be provided; and
26 27 28	Whereas, continued delays in delivery of help to persons experiencing chronic homelessness creates unnecessary hardships for not only the person but the person's community; and
29 30 31 32	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,'

This amendment, which is the majority report of the committee, adds an emergency preamble and emergency clause to the bill. It adds a requirement that the Department of Health and Human Services submit a report to the Joint Standing Committee on Housing and Economic Development by September 1, 2025, with details on the delivery of housing stability support services required by the Housing First Program and the requests for proposals process required by this legislation. The committee may report out legislation based on the report to the Second Regular Session of the 132nd Legislature. The amendment also replaces the appropriations and allocations section to correct a program name and number.
