1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 17-A MRSA §214 is enacted to read:
3	§214. Unborn children
4 5	1. As used in this section, unless the context otherwise indicates, the following terms have the following meanings.
6	A. "Conception" means the fusion of a human spermatozoon with a human ovum.
7 8	B. "Gestation" means the time during which a pregnant person carries an unborn child in the pregnant person's womb, from conception to birth.
9	C. "Unborn child" means the offspring of human beings from conception until birth.
10 11	2. For purposes of sections 201 to 203 and 207 to 208-F, the term "person" or "human being" includes an unborn child at every stage of gestation from conception until live birth.
12	3. This section does not apply to:
13	A. An act committed by the mother of an unborn child;
14 15 16	B. A lawful medical procedure performed by a physician or other licensed medical professional at the request of a mother of an unborn child or the mother's legal guardians or
17	C. The lawful dispensation or administration of lawfully prescribed medication.
18	SUMMARY
19 20 21 22 23	This bill provides that for certain provisions of the Maine Criminal Code, including those governing murder, manslaughter and assault, the term "person" or "human being" includes an unborn child. Exceptions are included for an act committed by the mother of an unborn child, a lawful medical procedure performed by a physician or other licensed medical professional at the request of a mother of an unborn child or the mother's legal
24	guardian or the lawful dispensation or administration of lawfully prescribed medication.
