2. It changes the name of the Maine Child Care Affordability Program Child Care Award to the Maine Child Care Affordability Program Child Care Employment Award.


3. It requires the report on the number of child care professionals participating in the

Fiscal Detail and Notes

The bill includes a one-time General Fund appropriation to the Department of Health and Human Services of \$3,800,000 in fiscal year 2025-26 and ongoing annual General Fund Appropriations of \$1,000,000 beginning in fiscal year 2025-26 for the Maine Child Care Affordability Program. The bill also includes ongoing annual General Fund appropriations to the Department of Health and Human Services of \$500,000 beginning in fiscal year 2025-26 for the Salary Sustainability Program for Child Care Professionals.

Any additional costs to the State Board of Education from the provisions of this bill are expected to be minor and can be absorbed within existing budgeted resources.
