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COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 763, L.D. 1955, "An Act to Increase Child Care Affordability and Early Childhood Educator Stability"

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Amend the bill by inserting before section 1 the following:

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'Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §3731-A, sub-§3 is enacted to read:

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3. Nonlapsing funds. Any unexpended funds appropriated or allocated by the Legislature or accepted by the commissioner for the purposes of the Maine Child Care Affordability Program may not lapse and must be carried forward in the same amount for the next fiscal year. The commissioner may accept donations or grants for the Maine Child Care Affordability Program from any source.'

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Amend the bill in section 1 in §3731-B in the headnote (page 1, line 3 in L.D.) by inserting after the following: "Program Child Care" the following: 'Employment'

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Amend the bill in section 1 in §3731-B in the first indented paragraph in the first line (page 1, line 4 in L.D.) by inserting after the following: "Program Child Care" the following: 'Employment'

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Amend the bill in section 1 in §3731-B by inserting after subsection 4 the following:

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'5. Nonlapsing funds. Any unexpended funds appropriated or allocated by the Legislature or accepted by the commissioner for the purposes of the award may not lapse and must be carried forward in the same amount for the next fiscal year. The commissioner may accept donations or grants for the award from any source.'

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Amend the bill in section 3 in §3737-B by striking out all of subsection 2 (page 2, lines 6 to 10 in L.D.) and inserting the following:

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'2. Report. Beginning on January 15, 2026, and annually thereafter, the department shall include in its annual report pursuant to section 3740-A the number of child care professionals participating in the program, expenditures under the program and a description of progress in implementing the tiered system required under subsection 4.'

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Amend the bill in section 3 in §3737-B by inserting after subsection 4 the following:

ROS

1 '5. Nonlapsing funds. Any unexpended funds appropriated or allocated by the
 2 Legislature or accepted by the commissioner for the purposes of the program may not lapse
 3 and must be carried forward in the same amount for the next fiscal year. The commissioner
 4 may accept donations or grants for the program from any source.'

5 Amend the bill in section 4 in §3737-C by striking out all of subsection 3 (page 3, lines
 6 4 to 6 in L.D.) and inserting the following:

7 '3. Nonlapsing funds. Any unexpended funds appropriated or allocated by the
 8 Legislature or accepted by the commissioner for the purposes of child care provider
 9 scholarships and apprenticeships may not lapse and must be carried forward in the same
 10 amount for the next fiscal year. The commissioner may accept donations or grants for the
 11 program from any source.'

12 Amend the bill in section 4 in §3737-C by striking out all of the 2nd indented paragraph
 13 (page 3, lines 7 to 11 in L.D.).

14 Amend the bill by inserting after section 4 the following:

15 'Sec. 5. 22 MRSA §3740-A, sub-§4 is enacted to read:

16 4. Child care professionals; salary. Beginning with the January 15, 2026 report,
 17 pursuant to section 3737-B, subsection 2, the number of child care professionals
 18 participating in the Salary Sustainability Program for Child Care Professionals established
 19 in section 3737-B.'

20 Amend the bill by striking out all of section 7 and inserting the following:

21 'Sec. 7. Appropriations and allocations. The following appropriations and
 22 allocations are made.

Fiscal Detail and Notes

The bill includes a one-time General Fund appropriation to the Department of Health and Human Services of \$3,800,000 in fiscal year 2025-26 and ongoing annual General Fund Appropriations of \$1,000,000 beginning in fiscal year 2025-26 for the Maine Child Care Affordability Program. The bill also includes ongoing annual General Fund appropriations to the Department of Health and Human Services of \$500,000 beginning in fiscal year 2025-26 for the Salary Sustainability Program for Child Care Professionals.

Any additional costs to the State Board of Education from the provisions of this bill are expected to be minor and can be absorbed within existing budgeted resources.
