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- 4. Requires the Board of Trustees of the Maine Criminal Justice Academy to incorporate critical incident debriefing in its training program; and
- 5. Provides funding for a Maine Criminal Justice Academy Law Enforcement Wellness Coordinator position within the Department of Public Safety.
