An Act to Address Funding Needs for State Employees Affected by Federal Funding Disruptions

1 **Emergency preamble.** Whereas, acts and resolves of the Legislature do not 2 become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and 3 Whereas, uncertainty and lack of clarity surrounds the distribution of federal funding 4 to state agencies; and Whereas, without federal funding, certain state agencies may have to lay off valuable 5 state employees; and 6 7 Whereas, if there are unavoidable layoffs, the State is bound, by contractual obligations, to give 10 days' notice of an impending layoff to any bargaining unit employee; 8 9 and 10 Whereas, any state employee subject to a layoff due to lack of federal funding may 11 qualify for unemployment benefits; and Whereas, state agencies will have to fund these unemployment benefits, which were 12 likely not accounted for in prior budgeting; and 13 14 Whereas, it is critically important that this legislation take effect before the expiration 15 of the 90-day period; and 16 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as 17 immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, 18 19 therefore, 20 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: 21 Sec. 1. Transfer from Reserve for General Fund Operating Capital to Department of Administrative and Financial Services, Departments and 22 23 Agencies - Statewide program, General Fund account. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the State Controller may transfer up to \$2,500,000 from 24 the balance available in the Reserve for General Fund Operating Capital to the Departments 25 and Agencies - Statewide program, General Fund account within the Department of 26 Administrative and Financial Services to address funding needs related to layoff 27 28 obligations for state employees affected by federal funding disruptions that are not otherwise directly chargeable to those federal funding sources. 29 30 Sec. 2. Transfer to Department of Administrative and Financial Services, 31 Departments and Agencies - Statewide program, General Fund account; special account funding. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the State 32 33 Controller may authorize the transfer of Personal Services expenditures to address funding needs related to layoff obligations for state employees affected by federal funding 34 disruptions that are not otherwise directly chargeable to those federal funding sources from 35 any federal fund account to the Departments and Agencies - Statewide program, General 36 Fund account within the Department of Administrative and Financial Services. 37 38 Expenditures may be transferred in circumstances in which federal funding has been appropriated or awarded and has been unexpectedly removed, to help cover the 10-day 39 notice period that is contractually required when a state employee is laid off and to cover 40 shortfalls in an agency's unemployment fund due to these unexpected layoffs. 41

1 Sec. 3. Transfer to Reserve for General Fund Operating Capital. 2 Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the State Controller on or before 3 June 30, 2026 shall transfer the unobligated balance from the Departments and Agencies -4 Statewide program, General Fund account within the Department of Administrative and 5 Financial Services to the Reserve for General Fund Operating Capital.

6 **Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this legislation 7 takes effect when approved.

8 SUMMARY

9 This bill addresses funding needs related to layoff obligations for state employees 10 affected by potential federal funding disruptions in the following ways.

It authorizes the transfer of up to \$2,500,000 from the balance available in the Reserve
for General Fund Operating Capital to the Departments and Agencies - Statewide program,
General Fund account within the Department of Administrative and Financial Services.

14 It authorizes the transfer of Personal Services expenditures from any federal fund 15 account to the Departments and Agencies - Statewide program, General Fund account 16 within the Department of Administrative and Financial Services.

17 It requires the State Controller, on or before June 30, 2026, to transfer the unobligated 18 balance from the Departments and Agencies - Statewide program, General Fund account 19 within the Department of Administrative and Financial Services to the Reserve for General

20 Fund Operating Capital.
