An Act to Limit Rates Charged to Low-income Electricity Consumers

Reported by Representative SACHS of Freeport for the Joint Standing Committee on Energy, Utilities and Technology pursuant to Public Law 2025, chapter 123, section 3, subsection 2.

1 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

2 **Sec. 1. 35-A MRSA §3203, sub-§4-D** is enacted to read:

3 **4-D. Low-income assistance; rate limitation.** A competitive electricity provider may
4 not enter into or renew a contract for generation service with a residential consumer
5 receiving low-income assistance authorized by section 3214, subsection 2 that would result
6 in a rate being charged to the consumer at any time that is more than the standard-offer
7 service rate established pursuant to section 3212. The commission may adopt rules to
8 implement this subsection, including, but not limited to, rules governing the sharing of low-
9 income assistance consumer data by a transmission and distribution utility with a
10 competitive electricity provider.

11 **SUMMARY**

12 This bill is reported out by the Joint Standing Committee on Energy, Utilities and
13 Technology pursuant to Public Law 2025, chapter 123, section 3. The bill prohibits a
14 competitive electricity provider from providing generation service to a residential
15 electricity consumer receiving low-income assistance at a rate that is more than the
16 standard-offer service rate. It authorizes the Public Utilities Commission to adopt routine
17 technical rules to implement this provision.

18 The committee has not taken a position on the substance of this bill. By reporting this
19 bill out, the committee is not suggesting and does not intend to suggest that it agrees or
20 disagrees with any aspect of this bill. The committee is reporting the bill out for the sole
21 purpose of having a bill printed that can be referred to the committee for an appropriate
22 public hearing and subsequent processing in the normal course. The committee is taking
23 this action to ensure clarity and transparency in the legislative review of the proposals
24 contained in the bill.
