COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 912, L.D. 2230, "An Act to Invest in the Construction of Industrialized Housing"

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Amend the bill in section 1 in subsection 1 in the 5th line (page 1, line 8 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "housing," and inserting the following: "housing and"

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Amend the bill in section 1 in subsection 1 in the 6th and 7th lines (page 1, lines 9 and 10 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "and housing units targeted to community workforce housing needs" and inserting the following: '~~and housing units targeted to community workforce housing needs~~'

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Amend the bill in section 1 in subsection 1 in the 12th, 13th and 14th lines (page 1, lines 15 to 17 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "housing manufacturers, developers and the general public with information about housing needs throughout the State and options available to meet those needs" and inserting the following: 'information to communities and the general public about the need for housing throughout the State, including industrialized housing, and provide guidance for meeting community housing needs'

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Amend the bill by striking out all of section 2.

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Amend the bill in section 3 in §13059-A in subsection 2 in the 3rd line (page 2, line 3 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "or loans"

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Amend the bill in section 3 in §13059-A in subsection 3 in the 3rd line (page 2, line 8 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "revolving,"

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Amend the bill in section 3 in §13059-A in subsection 4 in the first line (page 2, line 14 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "or loan"

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Amend the bill in section 3 in §13059-A by striking out all of subsection 5 (page 2, lines 23 to 28 in L.D.) and inserting the following:

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'5. Grants. The department may award a grant to a person eligible under subsection 4 in the following amounts per housing unit manufactured by the person and installed in the State:

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- 1 A. For any housing unit, \$1,500;
- 2 B. For a housing unit that is either affordable or energy-efficient, \$4,000; or
- 3 C. For a housing unit that is affordable and energy-efficient, \$6,000.

9 Amend the bill in section 4 in subsection 2 by inserting after paragraph J the following:

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT

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SUMMARY

This amendment, which is the majority report of the committee, does the following.

- 1. It removes reference to workforce housing from the current law governing the Housing Opportunity Program.
- 2. It changes the type of information and the audience for information provided by the Maine Office of Community Affairs under the Housing Opportunity Program.
- 3. It removes from the bill the requirement that the Maine Office of Community Affairs adopt rules defining "low income," "moderate income" and "middle income."
- 4. It removes from the bill the requirement that the Maine Office of Community Affairs adopt rules by January 1, 2027.
- 5. It limits the proposed Industrialized Housing Incentive Program to grants and not loans and specifies the grant amounts available by type of housing unit.
- 6. It adds an organization representing building trade workers to the group of entities the Department of Economic and Community Development must consult in designing the construction extension partnership program required by the bill.

Fiscal Detail and Notes

The bill creates the Industrialized Housing Incentive Program in the Department of Economic and Community Development and provides a one-time General Fund appropriation of \$300,000 in fiscal year 2026-27 for the costs of a subject matter expert to design and implement a pilot program. The bill also provides an Other Special Revenue Funds ongoing base allocation of \$500 beginning in fiscal year 2026-27 in the event that funds are received for grants to eligible manufacturers of industrialized housing.

Any additional costs to the Maine Office of Community Affairs, Department of Education, and Department of Labor from the provisions of this bill are expected to be minor and can be absorbed within existing budgeted resources.
