STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE concerning an amendment of the Constitution of Maine.

Resolved, That the following amendment to the Constitution 2 of this State be proposed for the action of the legal voters of 3 this State, in the manner required by the Constitution, to wit:

- 4 No. 6.
- 5 ELECTION OF SENATORS BY PLURALITY VOTE.
- 6 Senators shall be elected by a plurality of the votes given 7 in by the qualified electors.
- 8 Sections four and five of Article four, Part second of the
- 9 Constitution, are amended, by striking out the word "major-
- 10 ity" wherever it occurs in said sections, and inserting in-
- 11 stead thereof the word "plurality."
