## STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE concerning an amendment of the Constitution of Maine.

Resolved, That the following amendment to the Constitution 2 of this State be proposed for the action of the legal voters of 3 this State, in the manner required by the Constitution, to wit:

- 5 RELATING TO SPECIAL LEGISLATION AND CORPO-6 RATIONS.
- 7 Amend Article four, Part third of the Constitution, by add-8 ing thereto the following sections:

  1 Section 13. The Legislature shall, from time to time pro-
- 2 vide, as far as practicable, by general laws, for all matters
- 3 usually appertaining to special or private legislation.
- 1 Section 14. Corporations shall be formed under general
- 2 laws, and shall not be created by special acts of the Legisla-
- 3 ture, except for municipal purposes, and in cases where the
- 4 objects of the corporation cannot otherwise be attained; and,
- 5 however formed, they shall forever be subject to the general
- 6 laws of the State.
