RESOLVE concerning an amendment of the Constitution of
Maine.

Resolved, That the following amendment to the Constitution
2 of this State be proposed for the action of the legal voters of
3 this State, in the manner required by the Constitution, to wit :

POWER OF GOVERNOR TO PARDON.

6 Article five, Part first, Section eleven, shall be amended, by
7 striking out of said Section all after the word "reprieves," and
8 by adding thereto the following: Commutations and pardons,
9 except in cases of impeachment, upon such conditions, and
10 with such restrictions and limitations, as may be deemed
11 proper, subject to such regulations as may be provided by
12 law, relative to the manner of applying for pardons. And he
13 shall communicate to the Legislature, at each session thereof,
14 each case of reprieve, remission of penalty, commutation or
15 pardon granted, stating the name of the convict, the crime of
16 which he was convicted, the sentence and its date, the date of
17 the reprieve, remission, commutation, or pardon, and the con-
18 ditions, if any, upon which the same was granted.
