STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE concerning an amendment of the Constitution of
Maine.

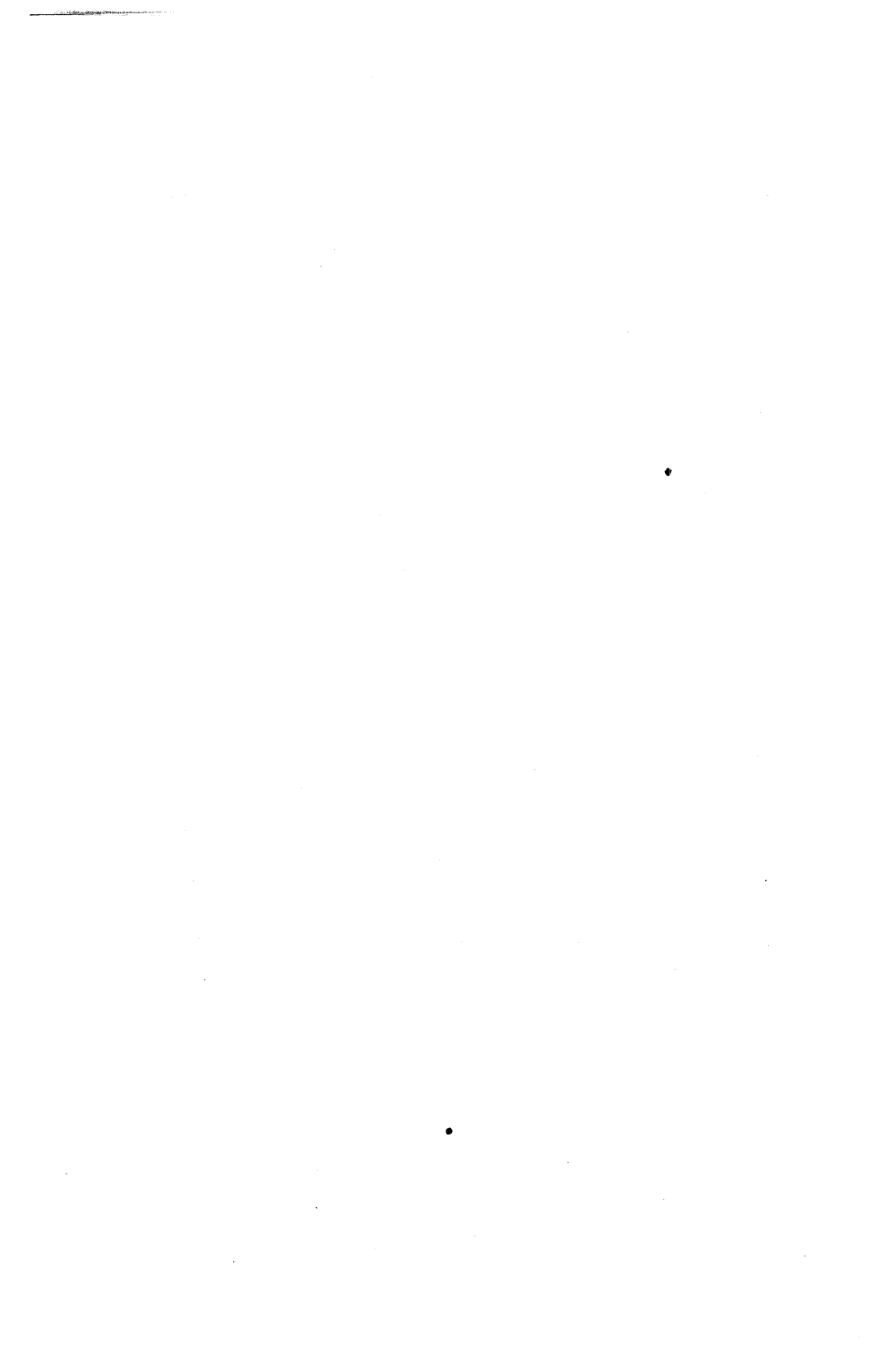
Resolved, That the following amendment to the Constitution
2 of this State be proposed for the action of the legal voters of
3 this State, in the manner required by the Constitution, to wit:

4 No. 13.

5 APPOINTMENT OF JUDGES OF MUNICIPAL AND
6 POLICE COURTS.

7 The Constitution shall be amended, by striking out Section
8 eight of Article six, and inserting the following:

9 SECTION 8. Judges of Municipal and Police Courts shall be
10 appointed by the Executive power, in the same manner as
11 other judicial officers, and shall hold their offices for the term
12 of four years. *Provided however*, that the present incum-
13 bents shall hold their offices for the term for which they were
14 elected.
