STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE making appropriations for the Penobscot tribeof indians.

Resolved, That there be paid from the state treasury, 2 to the agent of the Penobscot tribe of indians, to be 3 appropriated for the benefit of said tribe, as follows: 4 forty-four hundred and twenty-nine dollars and seventy 5 cents, amount of interest on their trust fund held by 6 the state for the benefit of said tribe; eighteen hun-7 dred dollars for their annual annuity; eight hundred 8 dollars for agricultural purposes; four hundred dollars 9 for bounty on crops; three hundred dollars for salary 10 of agent; one hundred and fifty dollars to pay compe-11 tent persons to be employed by the agent to assist and 12 instruct said indians in their agricultural labors, as 13 follows: seventy-five dollars on Oldtown and Orson 14 islands; thirty-seven dollars and fifty cents on Hem-15 lock, Sugar and Olamon islands; thirty-seven dollars

- 16 and fifty cents on Mattanawcook island; on the same
- 17 conditions as required by chapter ninety-six of the re-
- 18 solves of eighteen hundred and sixty-seven; and one
- 19 hundred dollars to be expended exclusively for chapel
- 20 repairs.
- 21 The following sums appropriated to be paid from
- 22 their shore rents: four hundred and fifty dollars for
- 23 schools, to be used in employing competent teachers,
- 24 viz., two hundred and fifty dollars on Oldtown island,
- 25 under the supervision of the superintending school com-
- 26 mittee of Oldtown; eighty dollars on Olamon island,
- 27 under the supervision of the superintending school com-
- 28 mittee of Greenbush; one hundred and twenty dollars
- 29 on Mattanawcook island, under the supervision of the
- 30 superintending school committee of Lincoln; and said
- 31 committee are required to report as directed in resolve
- 32 approved March seventeenth, eighteen hundred and
- 33 sixty, and it is the duty of said agent to see that the
- 34 money is fully expended for the education of the chil-
- 35 dren of said tribe. One hundred dollars for salary of
- 36 their priest, provided he says mass at least twenty-four
- 37 Sundays during the year with said tribe of indians;
- 38 fifty dollars for salary of their governor; thirty dollars
- 39 for salary of their lieutenant governor.
- 40 All the above named sums to be paid under the
- 41 direction of the governor and council.
