RESOLVE in favor of Benjamin B. Byron.

Resolved, That the land agent be hereby directed to

- 2 convey to Benjamin B. Byron lot numbered thirty-nine
- 3 (39) in township numbered five, range three, W. E.
- 4 L. S., waiving further settling duties.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Benjamin B. Byron has fully paid for this lot, and has on it a good and comfortable house. He has another lot in the adjoining town of Linneus which he purchased of proprietors, and on which he does much of his farming; have cleared but five acres of lot 39, under cultivation. Said lot 39 is heavily timbered with hemlock, and adjoins a large tract of bark land where some two thousand cords were peeled in the summer of 1875; and further clearing of land on said lot would be dangerous to the lands surrounding.
