STATE OF MAINE.

[S. 16.] RESOLVE in favor of the state road between Kingsbury Mills and Blanchard in Piscataquis county.

Resolved, That the sum of five hundred dollars be,

- 2 and that the same hereby is appropriated to repair the
- 3 state road called the New England road, between
- 4 Kingsbury Mills and Blanchard, to be expended under
- 5 the direction of the county commissioners of Piscata-
- 6 quis county.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

This road is the only thoroughfare between Somerset county and Moosehead Lake at present existing, and is a necessity to the lumbering interests of the Kennebec river. It is a State road, is wretchedly out of repair, and in consequence of the poverty of Kingsbury and the lack of population on its line, can only be kept open by means of State appropriations.
