STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of St. Francis plantation.

Resolved, That the sum of fifty dollars be, and is
2 hereby appropriated to aid in the construction of a
3 bridge over Hannevell brook, in the plantation of St.
4 Francis, in the county of Aroostook ; the same to be
5 paid out of the state treasury to the treasurer of St.
6 Francis, when the county commissioners of Aroostook
7 shall have certified that a good bridge has been built
8 over said brook.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

This bridge will cost some one hundred and fifty dollars. This plantation, though poor, would not ask for this little appropriation if no expenditure of money was needed. It is thought the above appropriation will be sufficient to purchase certain material that cannot be had without money, and the inhabitants of said plantation will furnish all labor, and the material which can be had without money.
