STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-SEVEN.

AN ACT requirng railroad corporations to be holden for labor.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

That chapter fifty-one of the revised statutes, be 2 amended, by adding thereto these words and figures: 3 "Sect. 84. Every railroad company in making con-4 tracts for the building of its road, shall require suffi-5 cient security from the contractors for the payment of 6 all labor thereafter performed in constructing the road 7 by persons in their employ; and such company shall 8 be liable to the laborers employed, for labor actually 9 performed on the road, if they within twenty days 10 after the completion of such labor shall, in writing, 11 notify its treasurer that they have not been paid by 12 the contractors."
