### STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-SEVEN.

### AN ACT to incorporate the Bath Driving Park.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. John H. Kimball, George H. Nichols,

- 2 William C. Duncan, E. B. Mayberry, J. A. McLellan,
- 3 Franklin Reed, P. O. Rogers, H. A. Huse, C. F. Peter-
- 4 son, W. T. Donnell, S. S. Jordan, Jere Shannon, all of
- 5 the county of Sagadahoc, their associates, successors,
- 6 and assigns, are hereby created a body politic and cor-
- 7 porate by the name of the Bath Driving Park, and by
- 8 that name shall have power to sue and be sued, prose-
- 9 cute and defend, all suits at law and in equity, and
- 10 shall have all rights and privileges incident to such
- 11 corporations, with right to adopt a common seal.
  - SECT. 2. The capital stock of said corporation may
  - 2 be fixed by the vote of the stockholders at an amount

- 3 not to exceed thirty-five thousand dollars, and shall be
- 4 divided into shares, the par value of which shall be
- 5 twenty-five dollars per share.
  - Sect. 3. Said corporation shall have power to pur-
- 2 chase and hold real estate in the county of Sagadahoc,
- 3 or in Brunswick in the county of Cumberland, the value
- 4 of which with improvements and betterments shall not
- 5 exceed twenty thousand dollars, and personal property
- 6 not exceeding in value ten thousand dollars, for the pur-
- 7 pose of constructing and maintaining a trotting park,
- 8 in order to aid in the improvement of the breed and
- 9 value of horses in this state, and may adopt such rules,
- 10 regulations and by-laws as shall be deemed necessary,
- 11 not repugnant to the laws of this state.
  - SECT. 4. All the powers and duties of the police of
  - 2 the city of Bath shall extend over such land as this
  - 3 corporation shall hold in Brunswick for the purpose
  - 4 herein named, concurrent with the police of Brunswick.
    - SECT. 5. The first meeting of corporators may be
  - 2 called by either of corporators, by giving public notice
  - 3 in the Bath Daily Times, seven days before the meet-
  - 4 ing.
    - SECT. 6. This act shall take effect when approved.
