STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-SEVEN.

AN ACT to amend section forty-four, chapter forty-nine of the revised statutes, relating to the office of insurance commissioner.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section forty-four, chapter forty-nine of the revised 2 statutes, is hereby amended by striking out the words 3 "twenty-five" in the sixth line and inserting the 4 word twelve in place thereof, and by adding at the 5 close of said section the following words: "He shall 6 give bond to the state, to be deposited in the office of 7 the treasurer, in such sum as the governor and council 8 direct, with good and sufficient sureties, with condi-9 tion that he will faithfully appropriate according to law 10 all moneys belonging to the state, which come to his

11 hands, and render annually a true account thereof to12 the governor and council." So that said section as13 amended shall read as follows :

14 Sect. 44. An insurance commissioner shall be ap-15 pointed by the governor and council, who shall hold 16 his office three years, unless sooner removed, but shall 17 not at the same time be examiner of banks. He shall 18 have no compensation for his official services except 19 the fees prescribed in the following sections; and if 20 they amount to more than twelve hundred dollars a 21 year, the balance shall be paid by him into the treasury 22 of state; and he shall keep an accurate account of all 23 fees received, and settle the same annually with the 24 governor and council. He may administer oaths in 25 the performance of his official duties, in any part of 26 the state, and at any time. He shall keep a correct 27 account of his doings, and of all matters relating to 28 the subject of insurance and insurance companies, on 29 which he is officially called to act. He shall give bond 30 to the state, to be deposited in the office of the treas-31 urer, in such sum as the governor and council direct, 32 with good and sufficient sureties, with condition that 33 he will faithfully appropriate according to law, all 34 moneys belonging to the state which come to his hands. 35 and render annually a true account thereof to the gov-86 ernor and council.
