STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of C. S. Hobbs of Norway.

Resolved, That the land agent be, and he is hereby
2 authorized to convey by deed to C. S. Hobbs of Nor-
3 way, an undivided half of lot numbered twenty-four,
4 in township number seventeen, range seven, according
5 to the survey and plan of said township made by John
6 S. Webber, waiving further settling duties ; and also
7 to pay to said Hobbs the sum of twenty-two dollars
8 and fifty cents, it being the amount paid by him for
9 the undivided half of said lot, the fee of which is not
10 in the state.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Mr. Hobbs received from the State a Land Certificate of the *whole* of the lot, eight years ago, at which time it was supposed that the State was the owner of all the settling lands in the township. It was afterwards ascertained, however, that certain individuals were possessed of an undivided half of them, under a prior deed from the Commonwealth of Massachusetts.
