STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-SEVEN.

AN ACT to prevent illegal voting.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Any person whose right to vote at any

- 2 election held in this state may be challenged, shall
- 3 make oath on affirmation to the qualifications re-
- 4 quired to make him a legal voter; and after a hear-
- 5 ing by the officer or officers presiding at said election,
- 6 or in committee appointed by such officer or officers,
- 7 if his right to vote is still challenged, he shall deposit
- 8 his vote in a sealed envelope with his name written on
- 9 the outside thereof; and said envelope shall not be
- 10 opened nor said vote counted until objections are with-
- 11 drawn or his right to vote is established to the satis-
- 12 faction of the governor and council.

SECT. 2. Any officer or officers presiding at any 2 election who shall neglect to carry out the provisions 3 of this act shall be subject to the penalties provided 4 in section fifty-one of chapter four of the revised 5 statutes.
