IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND
SEVENTY-SEVEN.

[S. 21.] AN ACT to authorize the appointment of police
officers at camp-meetings.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

The president and secretary of any camp-meeting
2 association in this state are hereby authorized to ap-
3 point one or more public officers, with full powers
4 usually pertaining to that office, to preserve the peace
5 within the circuit of one mile of the camp-ground
6 during the session of their meetings, and the written
7 certificate of said officers, approved by the presiding
8 elder or preacher in charge, shall qualify them to act.
