STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND
EIGHTY-ONE.

AN ACT to amend chapter one hundred and forty of
the public laws of eighteen hundred and seventy-
nine, relating to normal schools.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECTION 1. Section one, chapter one hundred and
2 forty of the public laws of eighteen hundred and
3 seventy nine is hereby amended, by striking out
4 the words "eighteen thousand," wherever occur-
5 ring in said chapter, and substituting therefor the
6 words "nineteen thousand," so that said chapter as
7 amended shall read as follows:

8 "Section one of chapter sixty-nine is hereby
9 amended, by striking out the words 'twenty two
10 thousand five hundred,' in the fifth line, and insert-

11 ing the words 'nineteen thousand.' Section two of
12 said chapter is amended by striking out the words
13 'twenty-two thousand five hundred,' in the fourth
14 line, and inserting the words 'nineteen thousand,'
15 so that said sections shall read as follows:

16 *Sect. 1.* That for the support of the three nor-
17 mal schools established by the state, namely: the
18 western normal school at Farmington, the eastern
19 normal school at Castine, and the western normal
20 school at Gorham, the sum of nineteen thousand
21 dollars is hereby annually appropriated, the same
22 to be expended under the direction of the normal
23 school trustees, as required by act of legislature,
24 chapter one hundred and fourteen, in the year of
25 our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-
26 three.'

27 *Sect. 2.* The treasurer of state is hereby author-
28 ized and directed to deduct from any of the school
29 moneys raised for the support of common schools
30 in the state, the sum of nineteen thousand dollars,
31 for the purposes indicated in this act.' "

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when ap-
2 proved.
