STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-ONE.

AN ACT to amend chapter eighty-five of the special laws of eighteen hundred and seventy-eight, entitled “an act to provide schools for the training of teachers in Madawaska territory,” as amended by chapter one hundred and ninety of the special laws of eighteen hundred and seventy-nine.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECTION 1. Section two of chapter eighty-five
2 of the special laws of eighteen hundred and seventy-
3 eight, as amended by chapter one hundred and
3 ninety of the special laws of eighteen hundred and
4 seventy-nine, is hereby amended to read as follows:
5 *Sect. 2.* To defray the expenses of said schools,
6 the sum of one thousand dollars is hereby appro-

7 priated in the manner hereinafter provided. The
8 treasurer of the state shall annually deduct from
9 any of the school moneys raised by the state for
10 the support of common schools, the sum of five
11 hundred dollars, and from the gross amount of the
12 state school funds of all descriptions, annually
13 apportioned to the towns of Grand Isle, French-
14 ville, Madawaska, Fort Kent and Van Buren, and
15 to the plantations of Hamlin, Connor, Cyr, St.
16 Francis, St. John, Wallagrass and Eagle Lake,
17 the like sum of five hundred dollars, which sums
18 shall remain in the treasury, subject to the order of
19 the governor and council, for the payment of the
20 expenses of said schools, the bills for which shall
21 be approved by the state superintendent of common
22 schools, and audited by the governor and council.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when ap-
2 proved.
