STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND-EIGHTY-ONE.

AN ACT to amend chapter one hundred and fortyfour of the public laws of eighteen hundred and seventy-six, entitled "an act relating to insurance companies."

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. Section twelve, of chapter one hun-2 dred and forty-four, of the public laws of eighteen 3 hundred and seventy-six, entitled "an act relating 4 to insurance companies," is hereby amended by 5 striking out the word "hereafter," in the first line, 6 and by adding at the end of the section the follow-7 ing: "The meetings of the directors shall be held 8 in this state," so that said section as amended shall 9 read as follows:

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10 Sect. 12. All insurance companies incorporated 11 and organized under the laws of this state, shall 12 have their principal place of business in some city 13 or town in this state, and a majority of its direc-14 tors shall be citizens of the state. The meetings 15 of the directors shall be held in this state.

SECT. 2. In all cases in which a majority of the 2 directors of any insurance company are not citizens 3 of this state, the terms of office of those residing 4 out of the state shall terminate on the twelfth day 5 of April, A. D. eighteen hundred and eighty-one, 6 and the directors then residing in this state are 7 invested with power to fill the vacancies, or such 8 of them as they deem necessary, until the next 9 annual meeting of the policy holders, when they 10 may fix the number of directors, and elect a full 11 board. No vacancy occurring in the board before 12 the thirteenth day of April, A. D. eighteen hun-13 dred and eighty-one, shall be filled till on or after 14 that day.

SECT. 3. The provisions of any charter incon-2 sistent with this act, are hereby repealed; and any 3 by-law of any company inconsistent herewith, is 4 declared void from and after the passage of this 5 act.

SECT. 4. This act shall take effect when approved.
