STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-ONE.

AN ACT to amend section thirty, of chapter one hundred and thirteen, of the revised statutes, in relation to the examination of a poor debtor and the oath to be taken by same.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section thirty, of chapter one hundred and thir-2 teen, of the revised statutes, is hereby amended so 3 as to read as follows:

4 Sect. 30. If on such examination and hearing 5 the debtor answers all interrogatories pertinent to 6 the inquiry, and the justices are satisfied that the 7 debtor's disclosure is true, they shall administer to 8 him the following oath:

9 I — do solemnly swear (or affirm) 10 that I have not any real or personal estate, or 11 interest in any, except what is exempted by stat-12 ute from attachment or execution, and what I have 13 now disclosed, so help me God (or this is under 14 the pains and penalties of perjury).
