STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVES providing for an amendment of the constitution, forever prohibiting the manufacture of intoxicating liquors, and prohibiting their sale except for medicinal and mechanical purposes, and the arts.

Resolved, Two-thirds of both branches of the

- 2 legislature concurring, that the constitution of this
- 3 state shall be amended by adding to it the follow-
- 4 ing provision, viz.:
- 5 The manufacture of intoxicating liquors, of what-
- 6 ever kind, for sale, is and shall be forever prohib-
- 7 ited, except the manufacture of cider, which is
- 8 remitted to the discretion of the legislature. The
- 9 sale and keeping for sale of intoxicating liquors,
- 10 of whatever kind, is and shall be forever prohib-
- 11 ited, except for medicinal and mechanical pur-
- 12 poses and for the arts, which shall be provided for

- 13 by law through suitable agencies appointed for 14 that purpose.
- 15 The sale of cider may be permitted under such
- 16 regulations as the legislature may provide.
- 17 The legislature shall from time to time enact
- 18 such laws, with whatever provisions and penalties
- 19 that may be deemed necessary for the entire sup-
- 20 pression of the manufacture and sale of intoxicat-
- 21 ing liquors, with the exceptions and conditions
- 22 herein specified.
- 23 Resolved, That the aldermen of cities, selectmen
- 24 of towns and assessors of plantations in the state,
- 25 are hereby empowered and directed to notify the
- 26 inhabitants of their respective cities, towns and
- 27 plantations in the manner prescribed by law, at
- 28 the September election next ensuing after the
- 29 passage and approval of these resolves, to give in
- 30 their votes on the amendment proposed in the
- 31 foregoing resolve; and the question shall be:
- 32 "Shall the constitution be amended so as to pro-
- 33 hibit forever the manufacture and sale and keeping
- 34 for sale of intoxicating liquors, except as provided
- 35 in the terms of the proposed amendment?"
- 36 And the inhabitants of said cities, towns and
- 37 plantations shall vote by ballot on said question.

- 38 The ballot to be employed in said voting shall
- 39 bear the words, "In favor of the amendment pro-
- 40 hibiting the manufacture and sale of intoxicating
- 41 liquors," or the words, "Opposed to the amend-
- 42 ment prohibiting the manufacture and sale of
- 43 intoxicating liquors."
- 44 But ballots bearing the word "Yes," or the word
- 45 "No," shall also be received and counted as in
- 46 favor of, or opposed to the amendment.
- 47 The ballots so cast and received shall be sorted,
- 48 counted and declared in open ward, town and
- 49 plantation meeting, and fair list of the votes shall
- 50 be made out by the aldermen of cities, selectmen
- 51 of towns and assessors of plantations, and signed
- 52 by them and attested by the clerks, and returned
- 53 to the office of secretary of state within thirty days
- 54 after the election.
- 55 And the governor and council shall open, exam-
- 56 ine and count the same immediately after the
- 57 expiration of said thirty days; and if it shall appear
- 58 that a majority of the votes cast and returned on
- 59 the question is in favor of said amendment, it shall
- 60 then be a part of the constitution, and the gov-
- 61 ernor shall make known the fact by his proclama-
- 62 tion.

63 Resolved, That the secretary of state shall pre-64 pare and furnish to the several cities, towns and 65 plantations blank returns in conformity with the 66 foregoing resolves, accompanied by a copy thereof.
