STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-THREE.

AN ACT to protect officers in the service of process, civil and criminal.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. If any person shall wilfully obstruct

- 2 any officer, or other person duly authorized in the
- 3 service of any lawful process or order in any civil
- 4 case, or in any criminal case the punishment of
- 5 which may be imprisonment in the common jail and
- 6 fine, or either, he shall be punished by imprison-
- 7 ment not exceeding one year and by fine not ex-
- 8 ceeding three hundred dollars.

SECT. 2. If any person shall wilfully obstruct

- 2 any officer, or other person duly authorized, in
- 3 the service of any criminal process for any offence

- 4 punishable by imprisonment for more than one
- 5 year, he shall be punished by imprisonment not
- 6 exceeding two years or by fine not exceeding five
- 7 hundred dollars, or both.
