STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-THREE.

AN ACT relating to the taking of herring, and canning sardines.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- Section 1. No person shall catch, take, pre-
- 2 serve, sell or offer for sale within the state any
- 3 herring for canning purposes less than eight inches
- 4 long, measured from one extreme to the other,
- 5 between the fifteenth day of December, and the
- 6 fifteenth day of April next following.
 - SECT. 2. No person shall pack or can any sar-
- 2 dines of any description, between the fifteenth day
- 3 of December and the fifteenth day of April next
- 4 following.

SECT. 3. Any person violating the provisions of 2 this chapter shall be punished by a fine of twenty 3 dollars for every one hundred cans so packed or 4 canned, and for every one hundred herring taken 5 contrary to the provisions of section one, to be re-6 recovered in an action of debt to be brought by 7 any person complaining of the same, one half to 8 the complainant, and the other half to the town in 9 which said offence is committed.
