STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-THREE.

AN ACT to amend section four, chapter seventeen, revised statutes, relating to nuisances.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows

Section four, chapter seventeen of the revised stat2 utes is hereby amended by adding thereto the following
3 words: "and it shall be the duty of the officer
4 making seizure of intoxicating liquors in any
5 building or tenement where it is kept for unlawful
6 sale, immediately after the conviction of the ac7 cused, to serve a written notice on the owner or
8 agent of such building or tenement, naming the
9 accused, his offence and conviction, and said notice
10 shall be sufficient knowledge to the owner, of his

11 tenant's violation of the law, and his own liability 12 under this section. Said officer shall make proper 13 return on said notice and cause the same to be 14 recorded in the office of the town or city clerk in 15 a book kept for that purpose," so that said section 16 shall read as follows:

Sect. 4. If any person knowingly lets any 17 18 building owned by him or under his control for 19 any of the purposes in the first section named, or 20 knowingly permits the same or a part thereof to 21 be so used, shall be deemed guilty of aiding in the 22 maintenance of a nuisance and be punished by a 23 fine of not less than one hundred nor more than 24 one thousand dollars, or by imprisonment in the 25 county jail not less than thirty days or more 26 than six months; and it shall be the duty of the 27 officer making seizure of intoxicating liquors in 28 any building or tenement where it is kept for 29 unlawful sale, immediately after the conviction of 30 the accused, to serve a written notice on the owner 31 or agent of such building or tenement, naming the 32 accused, his offence and conviction, and said notice 33 shall be sufficient knowledge to the owner, of his 34 tenant's violation of the law, and his own liability 35 under this section. Said officer shall make proper

36 return on said notice and cause the same to be 37 recorded in the office of the town or city clerk in 38 a book kept for that purpose.
