IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-THREE

AN ACT to amend section fourteen of chapter fifty of the public laws of eighteen hundred and seventyeight, relating to insectivorous birds.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section fourteen of chapter fifty of the public laws

- 2 of eighteen hundred and seventy-eight, is hereby
- 3 amended by adding thereto the following words, viz:
- 4 "Under a penalty of not less than one dollar nor
- 5 more than five dollars for each of said birds killed,
- 6 or in possession except alive," so that as amended
- 7 said section will read as follows, viz:
- 8 Sect. 14. No person shall kill or have in his
- I possession, except alive, any of the birds commonly

10 known as larks, robins, swallows, sparrows or 11 orioles, or other insectivorous birds, crows and 12 hawks excepted, under a penalty of not less than 13 one dollar nor more than five dollars for each of 14 said birds killed, or in possession except alive.
