IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND
EIGHTY-THREE

AN ACT to amend section one of chapter one hundred and fourteen of the revised statutes, relating to duties payable by public officers.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECTION 1. Section one of chapter one hundred 2 and fourteen of the revised statutes is amended by 3 striking out the word "or" between the words 4 justice and notary and inserting the words "cor- 5 oner, taxidermist, dedimus justice, or inspector of 6 fish," between the words "public" and "shall," so 7 that the said section as amended shall read as 8 follows:

9 *Sect. 1.* No person appointed to the office of 10 justice of the peace, justice of the peace and quo-

11 rum, trial justice, notary public, coroner, taxider-
12 mist, dedimus justice or inspector of fish shall enter
13 upon the discharge of his official duties until he
14 has paid five dollars to the treasurer of state, or of
15 the county for which he is appointed.

SECT. 2. Section three of chapter one hundred
2 and fourteen of the revised statutes is hereby
3 repealed.
