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## STATE OF MAINE.

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IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND  
EIGHTY-THREE.

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AN ACT to amend section thirty-five (35) and thirty-six (36) of chapter sixty-three (63) of the revised statutes, relating to the publication of notices in probate proceedings

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*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECTION 1. That section thirty-five of chapter  
2 sixty-three of the revised statutes be amended by  
3 inserting the words "or published" after the word  
4 "printed" in the third line, so that said section as  
5 amended shall read as follows:

6 *Sect. 35.* In all laws relating to probate courts  
7 and proceedings, the words "public notice" denote  
8 notice published three weeks successively in a  
9 newspaper printed or published in the county, or,

10 if none, in the state paper; the words "personal  
11 notice" denote service by a copy given in hand or  
12 left at the place of last and usual abode, seven days  
13 at least before the time of hearing, and the words  
14 "due notice" denote public or personal notice, at  
15 the discretion of the judge.

SECT. 2. That section thirty-six of chapter sixty-  
2 three of the revised statutes, be amended by insert-  
3 ing the words "or published" after the word  
4 "printed" in the second line, so that said section as  
5 amended shall read as follows:

6 *Sect. 36.* Any notice to be published in a news-  
7 paper, shall be published in such paper printed or  
8 published in the county as the party required to  
9 publish it selects, unless the judge deems such  
10 paper unsuitable from want of circulation or other  
11 substantial reason.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect on and after  
2 the date of its approval by the governor.
