STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-THREE.

AN ACT to amend section seven, chapter one hundred and thirty-six of the revised statutes, relating to trial justices and judges of municipal and police courts.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section seven, chapter one hundred and thirty-

- 2 six of the revised statutes, is hereby amended
- 3 by striking out all of said section and inserting
- 4 in place thereof the following:
- 5 Sect. 7. Every trial justice or judge of a muni-
- 6 cipal or police court shall render, under oath, an
- 7 account of, and pay over all fines and forfeitures
- 8 by him received upon convictions and sentences
- 9 before him, accruing to the county, to the treasurer
- 10 of the county, and when they accrue to the town,

11 to the treasurer of the town, within three months 12 after he receives the same; and for any neglect he 13 shall forfeit and pay in each instance double the 14 amount, to be recovered in an action of debt, in the 15 name of the county treasurer, when they accrue 16 to the state or county, and in the name of the town 17 treasurer, when they accrue to the town. Every 18 judge of a municipal or police court in any city 19 shall, once in each month, make and return under 20 oath to the mayor and aldermen of said city, and 21 every judge of a municipal or police court in any 22 town, shall, once in each month, make and return, 23 under oath, to the municipal officers of said town, 24 a correct account of all examinatons and trials had 25 before him of persons accused of offences, and of 26 all fines and forfeitures by him imposed or re-27 ceived, upon conviction or sentence, and of all 28 fees and costs by him received, under a penalty of 29 one hundred dollars for each neglect to be re-30 covered by indictment.
