## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-THREE.

AN ACT to amend sections one and two of chapter twenty-nine of the public laws of eighteen hundred and seventy-eight.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- Section 1. That section one of chapter twenty-
- 2 nine of the public laws of eighteen hundred and
- 3 seventy-eight, is hereby amended by adding after
- 4 the word "development" in the third line the words
- 5 "with the machinery and works necessary to de-
- 6 velop the same," so that said section when so
- 7 amended shall read as follows:
- 8 Sect. 1. That all mines of gold and silver or of
- 9 the baser metals which are now or may be opened

- 10 and in process of development with the machinery
- 11 and works necessary to develop the same shall be
- 12 exempt from taxation for a term of ten years from
- 13 the time of said opening.
- 14 That section two of said chapter be amended by
- 15 striking out the words "or the surface improve-
- 16 ment of the same" in the second line and substitute
- 17 the words "or buildings thereon not used for min-
- 18 ing purposes," so that said section when amended
- 19 shall read as follows, viz:
- 20 Sect. 2. This act shall not affect the taxation of
- 21 the lands or buildings thereon not used for mining
- 22 purposes, at the same rate of valuation as similar
- 23 lands and buildings in the vicinity.
  - SECT. 2. This act takes effect when approved.
