STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-THREE:

AN ACT to amend section nine of chapter fifth of the revised statutes, relating to lands reserved for public uses.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. That section nine of chapter five of

- 2 the revised statutes be amended, by striking out
- 3 the words "or organized into plantations" in the
- 4 sixth line of said section, so that said section shall:
- 5 read as follows:
- 6 "In every township there shall be reserved one
- 7 thousand acres of land and at the same rate in all
- 8 tracts less than a township, for the exclusive bene-
- 9 fit of such town or tract as the legislature directs,
- 10 to average in quality and situation and value as to
- 11 timber with the other lands therein. In townships

- 12 or tracts sold and not incorporated, the lands re-
- 13 served for public uses may be selected and located
- 14 by the land agent and the proprietors, by a written
- 15 agreement, describing them by metes and bounds,
- 16 signed by them and recorded in the land office.
- 17 The plan or outline of the lands so selected shall
- 18 be entered on the plan of the township or tract in
- 19 the land office, which shall be a sufficient location
- 20 thereof."
 - SECT. 2. This act shall take effect from its 2 approval.
